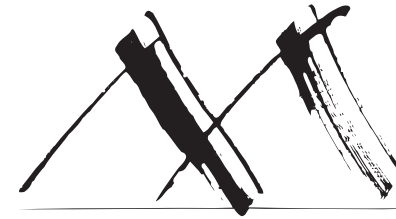


TRAIL MAP

THE ORGANIZATION

Founded by the late acclaimed artist David Barr, the Art Park is a natural extension and reflection of his work and global influence. Barr envisioned creating a place in nature for artists to install art inspired by the stories of the people, events and natural resources that continue to shape the legacy of Michigan. Committed to artistic excellence, the objective remains the same today: curate a collection of permanent and ephemeral works of art for the purpose of engaging visitors with a visual, intellectual and emotional experience to deepen their understanding of Michigan's history, culture and environment.

Michigan Legacy Art Park is nonprofit organization located on a 30-acre preserve that is generously leased from Crystal Mountain for \$1 per year. The partnership between Crystal Mountain and Michigan Legacy Art Park has been from its inception one of a shared vision.

Discover how artists bring Michigan history to fresh and vivid life. View inspiring sculptures and poetry stones as you hike through this 30-acre nature preserve.

Taken at a leisurely pace with moments for reflection, a hike through the Art Park lasts between ninety minutes and two hours and covers nearly 2 miles of trails.

Along your hike, you will discover over forty sculptures, thirty poetry stones and an area of student work.

ADMISSION

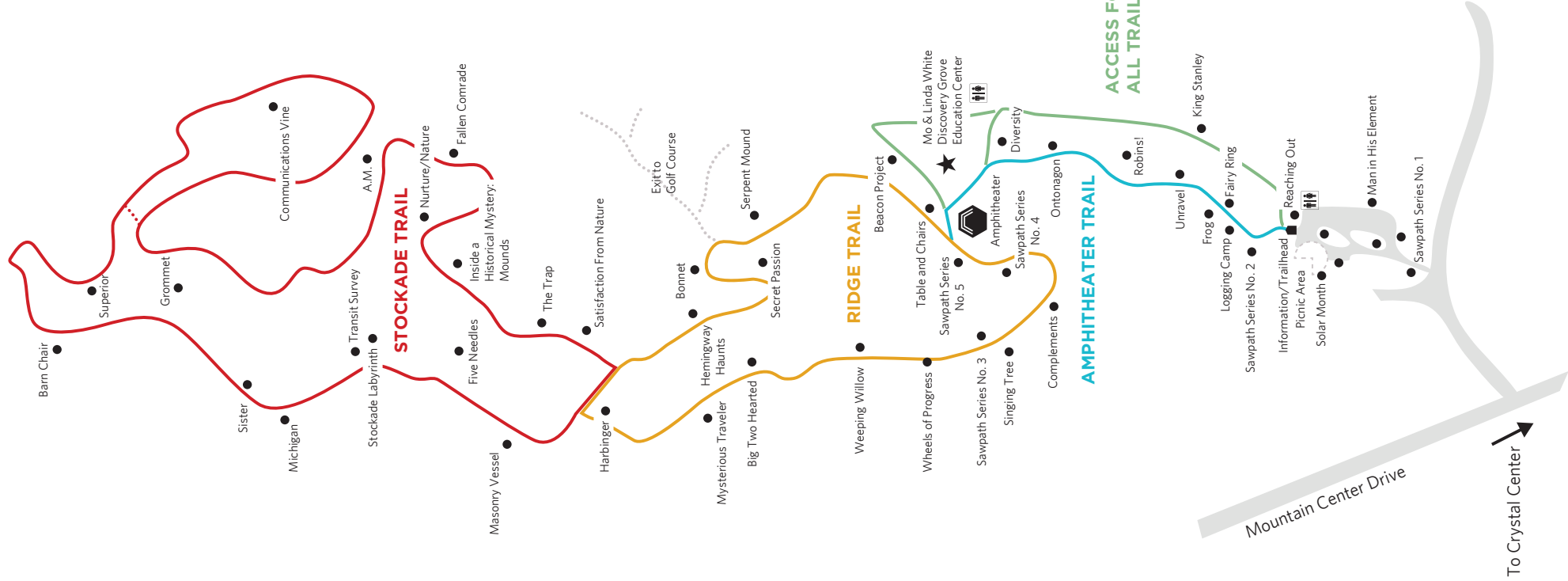
\$5 per adult, children free
